

Asking Questions

“Is there/Are there...?” Yes/No Questions

Be + there + subject.

Example:

Question (Singular) *Is there a map on the Web site?*

Sentence (Singular) No. There is no map on the Web site.

Question (Plural) *Are there any maps on the Web site?*

Sentence (Plural) No. There are no maps on the Web site.

How do you answer “yes” to these questions?

“How many....?” Questions

How many + subject + are there + location.

Example:

Sentence: There are five states on Virginia’s borders.

Question: *How many states are there on Virginia’s borders?*
